

# South East Alberta Rural Crime Watch Association Call for Directors

SE AB Rural Crime Watch Association Directors are elected to three-year terms. It is their role to help govern the association; provide direction; understand the needs of members and owners; and ensure the Board acts in the best interests of members. Board members have a fiduciary duty to act honestly and in good faith, with a view to the best interests of SEABRCW. Directors attend General meetings (quarterly) and any additional meetings or committee meetings as required, including the AGM. We are currently seeking to fill one (1) Director position in each of our Zones, which are the County of Forty Mile and Cypress County.

We're seeking nominations for candidates who meet the criteria in the following areas:

- Individuals who will uphold the values of the Rural Crime Watch program in both word and action.
- Exhibits SEABRCW's core values and acts with exceptional ethical integrity and in the best interests of the Rural Crime Watch.
- Always willing to listen, learn, and develop. Able to apply learning and make wise strategic decisions.
- Act in accordance with the provisions as spelled out in Section 6 of the Association Bylaws (found on our public website).
- Adhere to all policies and regulations as approved from time to time by the Board.
- Represent the decisions of the majority of the Board –maintain the power of the Board as a whole.
- Bring forth nominations to the AGM from their Zone for the replacement of retiring Directors.
- Holds a current membership to SEABRCW.

Zone Directors will be nominated by the members from each Zone at the AGM on September 9, 2021 and votes will be taken by the members from each Zone that are present (and fulfill quorum needs) at the AGM. Memberships can be purchased at the meeting.
